# RECYCLE YOUR OLD CHRISTMAS LIGHTS AGAIN THIS YEAR!

Last season, Dubois County residents recycled over 1400 pounds of old Christmas lights, and the Dubois County Solid Waste District asks residents to recycle, rather than throw away, old strings of Christmas lights again this year.


From Friday,
November 21 to
Friday, January
16, Dubois County
residents can recycle
strands of old lights
at the Solid Waste
District Process
Center and at the
Jasper Rural King
store during regular
hours.

"We provide decorated cardboard barrels just inside the Rural King entrance, and we ask that residents just dump their strands of lights in the barrel without packaging," says Solid Waste District Director, Carla Striegel-Winner. "This

is our 7th season, with a total of 9,355 pounds of strands being recycled. Keep up the good recycling work, Dubois County!"

The program accepts strands of electric lights only, not rigid frames such as yard shapes. The strands are recyclable due to the metal wires that are in the cords.

This recycling program is in cooperation with Jasper Salvage, Jasper Rural King and the **Dubois County Solid** Waste District. The **District Process** Center is located at 1103 S. 350 W., Jasper. ## Hidden things that give you purpose

A lot of people want to know how to study the Bible. When I study, I like to pick out what is relevant for the time. Relevancy seems to have more of a lasting impression on me than reading just to be reading.

To me, Bible study is like an old suitcase you find in an attic. You open it up, pick up one item at a time and examine it carefully.

Curious people, "junkers and collectors" will know what I'm talking about.

Some things you stuff back into the suitcase because you may need it later. Some you set aside because you don't really think it affects you right now.

Other things you take out, put it on, and use all the time. Things that give you purpose and direction. When you open the

Bible, the suitcase, pray and ask God to direct your mind and thoughts to what he has for you on that particular day.

I unpacked a verse like that this week. It's found in Zephaniah. It says, "Seek the LORD, all you meek of the earth, who have upheld His justice.

Seek righteousness, seek humility. It may be that you will be hidden in the day of the LORD's anger" (Zephaniah 2:3).

A time of worldwide judgment is coming. Even Hollywood producers believe an end is inevitable.

We know that because so many movies have plots that lean toward world destruction and a hero that comes in to deliver.

In spite of coming judgement, believers in God have hope. Zephaniah said, "It may be that you will be hidden in the day of the Lord's anger".



One thing is sure, he takes us through it or delivers us from it. If we go through the fire, he'll be with us.

That's a verse you can unpack and use daily.

In Revelations John wrote, "Because you have kept my command to persevere, I also will keep you from the hour of trial which shall come upon the whole world, to test those who dwell on the earth" (Revelation 3:10).

Zephaniah said, "Seek the Lord, all you meek of the earth ... It may be that you will be hidden." I always think of a meek person as one who has reigned in his/her strengths to the degree that they get good results.

Picture a powerful stallion. Full of fire, vigor and strength. In the wild it runs haphazard, bullying its way through life. But, when it's tamed, it has learned how to harness its power and be "gently strong". It learns how to be useful.

Taming a horse does not make it any less

powerful. It has no less vigor.

Its powerful muscles are just as strong and just as dangerous, but training has taught him controlled power. He directs his power in a meaningful and effective way. In the same way, a meek person has controlled power which makes him/her more effective.

To me, that's what "meek" means. You are no less the person you were, but you know how to be "gently strong." You learn how to be useful. The meek person has learned how to reign in their emotions, their conversations, and their power. They don't use their position to push, but to lead. They are effective. They get results.

Jesus said, "The meek shall inherit the earth" (Matthew 5:5).

"Seek the LORD, all you meek of the earth, who have upheld His justice." The meek stand strong and uphold His justice. Not their own justice, but God's.

Choosing between what God says is right and what your own opinions are, can be a hard thing to do because we look at things different than God.

Our opinions may sway by the circumstance, but God is just. He always does the right and just thing.

A meek person is teachable and willing to learn.

When you discover the will of God, (which is to love God and treat people right), we just run in that direction.

Which is more pleasant to be around? The wild horse or the tame horse?

One who is useful or one who stomps around meaninglessly without direction or purpose?

In the end, focus and purpose gets better results.



## **Essential gear for first-time Thanksgiving hosts**

Hosting Thanksgiving is a large undertaking that can put some hosts under pressure. Unlike some other holidays that are less food-focused, Thanksgiving is largely about the meal. Turkey is the centerpiece of the celebration, and any guests who come over are going to expect turkey and a number of side dishes. Leaving hungry is never an option on Thanksgiving.

Individuals who are new to Thanksgiving hosting may be at a loss as to where to start with their preparation. There are certain must-haves hosts should familiarize themselves with. Many of these essentials revolve around tools for cooking in the kitchen and serving guests.

• Large roasting pan: You'll need somewhere to oven-roast the turkey. While it's perfectly acceptable to purchase a disposable aluminum pan for this purpose, if you plan to host Thanksgiving year after year, investing in a quality roasting pan will help deliver even cooking temperatures to the food and also can be used for roasting other meats.

· Wire rack: The turkey is placed upon a rack inside of the roasting pan so that it will not swim in the juices and cause a soggy bottom during cooking. Many roasting pans and racks are sold as sets, but others can be purchased separately. The rack can be used for other purposes as well, including cooling baked cookies or even drying out fresh herbs.

• Food thermometer: Ensuring the turkey and other foods are cooked to the correct internal temperature is essential. You do not want to send guests home with foodborne



illnesses. Food thermometers run the gamut from very basic to those that can be programmed to alert cooks through an app on a smartphone. Turkey is done when the temperature reads 170 F in the breast and 180 F in the thigh. If stuffed, the stuffing should register 165 F, according to Butterball.

• Coordinated casserole dishes:
Casserole dishes can hold all of the sides served with the turkey, including stuffing, sweet potatoes, mashed potatoes, green beans, and more.
A set of matching dishes will help the tablescape look more coordinated.

• Service for eight or more: Thanksgiving draws a crowd, so take inventory of silverware, dishes, wine glasses, and any other table needs to ensure that you can accommodate all of the guests. Purchase new items if you cannot set the table completely with what you have, as mixed

and matched may be okay for informal events but may not set the tone hosts are aiming for on Thanksgiving.

• Table and chairs:
Determine if you have enough table space to seat all of your guests. Some dining tables come with an extension leaf, but you still may need to supplement with a folding table. You may need more seating. Chairs can be rented or you can utilize some folding chairs.

• Turkey serving platter: When the turkey is ready, it can be placed on an attractive serving platter for your photos, after which you slice and then return the sliced poultry to the serving platter for dining.

Thanksgiving requires a number of essentials that hosts will need to have on hand to make the holiday complete.

## How to navigate holiday shipping charges

Shoppers can save a lot if they purchase several gifts from one retailer and meet that threshold.

• Consider ship-to store options. Many retailers offer the opportunity to ship-tostore for free. This can be advantageous for retailers because, once inside the store to pick up the shipment, a consumer may be more inclined to purchase additional items. ## Thanksgiving has not always included the infamous turkey

Though modern
Americans might find
the notion of a turkeyfree Thanksgiving
hard to fathom, the
idea of eating the now
popular fowl did not
become synonymous
with the holiday until
the mid-nineteenth
century.

According to History.com, President George Washington declared a day of national thanksgiving in 1789, but decades passed before turkey came to be presented as a staple of Thanksgiving celebrations. History.com notes that novelist Sarah Joseph Hale offered a lengthy description of Thanksgiving

celebrations in New England in her 1827 novel, Northwood. Hale eventually drew on the writings of William Bradford, who served as Governor of the Plymouth Colony from 1621 to 1657.

Bradford's history of the colony noted the abundance of turkeys around the time of the first Thanksgiving meal, and Hale ultimately drew on Bradford's recollection and incorporated turkey into her depictions of Thanksgiving meals after expending much energy promoting the idea of a national Thanksgiving holiday throughout the middle decades of the nineteenth century.

## The importance of labeling emotions

One of the hardest things for a parent is to see their child struggle and not have the power to "fix" it. We all want happy, healthy children. In order to achieve that, however, we must allow kids to experience and understand a whole range of emotions.

When children learn that all emotions

are acceptable and a normal part of human life, they can begin to cope with those emotions in healthy and positive ways. This helps them build empathy, resilience, and more positive selfesteem. When we talk openly with children about their emotions. we also teach them that we are a supportive, safe space, regardless of what they are experiencing.

Here are some simple ways to

support your child's emotion identification skills:

Talk about emotions daily. Make it a habit to check in with your child about how they are feeling, and then really listen to what they have to say. Don't rush to resolve or soothe their feelings. Be a safe support before you offer to help with solutions.

Recognize your child's emotions and respond with compassion. Again, it is easy to offer reassurance, but this may come off as dismissive to your child. If they tell you they are scared and you respond with, "There's nothing to be scared of," you are not hearing them as they express their emotions. One of the easiest ways to respond with compassion is by repeating your child's emotion back to them. "I can see you are feeling sad. Do you

want to talk about it?" Model, model, model. The best thing we can do as parents is to demonstrate healthy ways to respond to emotions. Kids learn by observing the world around them. When we continually show our children that hard emotions can be handled in positive ways, they will follow suit.

Help your child develop a range of tools to use when coping with difficult emotions. There is no "one-size-fits-all" solution for emotional regulation. If deep breaths work for one person, they may not work for the next. Some skills can be used at home but not in a classroom. Brainstorm several

different strategies for your child to have available.

Ask your child to identify emotions in others, as well. As your child learns to recognize their own feelings, help them recognize feelings in those around them. What does a sad, happy, scared face look like? How can you tell your friend is angry? This helps build empathy and an understanding of how to support the emotions of others in a healthy way.

Successful adults possess the ability to understand and regulate emotions. You can help support your child's future success by building emotion identification skills now.
