Illinois wheat development board elects new members

SPRINGFIELD, IL – Eligible wheat producers interested in becoming a candidate for the Illinois Wheat Development Board can request nominating petitions.

"I encourage interested producers to engage in this process, to take an active role in shaping the future of the wheat industry," said Jerry Costello II, Director of the Illinois Department of Agriculture. "As the 10th largest producer of wheat in the U.S., Illinois holds a strong position with great potential for growth."

Those interested can obtain petitions from the Illinois Wheat Association or the Illinois Department of Agriculture. The deadline to return completed petitions to Illinois Department of Agriculture is September 15, 2025.

Interested producers must be of legal voting age and be affected producers of wheat residing in the district for which they are nominated. Petitions must contain the signature of at least 50 or 5%, whichever is less of the eligible producers residing in the candidate's district. Affected producers may also request petitions to become a candidate for (3) three, at-large board member positions. Candidate petitions must carry the signature of at least 50 or 5%, whichever is less of the affected producers statewide.

The Illinois Wheat Development Board election will be held on October 30, 2025. For more information, call the Illinois Department of Agriculture at (217) 524-1083 or the Illinois Wheat Association at (309) 557-3619.

Broken down walls leave you vulnerable

There is a proverb that will serve you well, throughout your entire life. You'll find it in Proverb 25:28 where King Solomon warns us: "He that hath no rule over his own spirit is like a city that is broken down, and without walls." There are some problems with a city that is broken down, and without walls. There are some problems with a soul that is broken down, and without walls.

The first problem is what we let in and what we don't let in. A city without walls is open range. So is a soul without walls. It is my belief that humans have to have some restriction because it's very easy to go off the rails. Without walls, there is no control and no way to keep out evil influence. That is especially true for

the person "who has no rule over his own spirit.". When we have no rule over our own spirit, we're like a city with no control and no way to keep out the influence of evil.

In most cases, evil comes in quietly. It doesn't come in like they depict in the old shootim'-up-western shows that most of us grew up with. In my experience, evil creeps in. Quietly.

For proof, let's take Solomon, who wrote most of the book of Proverbs. Although it's recorded that he was the wisest man who ever lived, we find he was far more influenced by people he hung around with than he realized. According to scripture, Solomon did not turn toward other gods...he turned toward his many wives, who turned him toward other gods (1 Kings 11:3).

are no restrictions and no restriction always invites trouble.

The devil is looking for souls without walls or with broken doors. It's up to us to guard the doors of

our hearts. We can't leave the door open and let the devil pick off our family, our finances, our peace of mind and our strength.

It was Solomon who advised us to

guard the door of our heart (Prov 4: 23-27) and maybe he was speaking from experience. I believe he was telling us we must guard the door of our heart because it's harder to fight the devil when we let him right in our living room. It's easier if he's kept on the outside of the door where he doesn't get a strong foothold.

Reading through Proverbs, we find Soloman warning us, from many different angles, to recognize the influencers around us. Choose influencers who will not "turn your heart toward other gods"

Remember: Soloman didn't choose other gods. He chose the people to be around him who influenced him to turn to other gods.

It is our own best interest to choose our influencers well. Broken walls, leaves broken souls.

Every person's pupils were practically glued to the pandemonium among the pirates and pillagers. **Buccaneers** swung from the crow's nest to the main deck, battling raiders and robbers with their blood-drawing blades. "Avast ye! Give no quarter to these scurvy dogs!" yelled the captain. After a brief brawl, the invaders were repelled and the ruckus settled down. And that's when I saw it: a man stepping out of the shadows to mop the deck.

While watching the Pirates Voyage Dinner & Show in Panama City, Florida, I couldn't help but notice the stagehands who quietly emerged from behind the scenes to keep the stage safe and prepare for the next act. They unhooked ropes, removed and repositioned props, and checked on the actors to ensure everything was running smoothly. They weren't the center of attentiontheir job was to

guarantee that the stage was set for the main actors who were. They weren't the stars of the show and received no applause. They had one mission: to ensure the spotlight shined on the real stars.

And this is precisely what Christians are called to do for Christ. Believers are stagehands for the Savior. Jesus is highly exalted "far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named" (Eph. 1:21a), and our job as believers is to keep it that way in our hearts and lives. The mission statement of our lives ought to be that of John the Baptizer: "He must increase, but I must decrease" (John 3:30). As the reformer John Calvin once said, this world is a "theater for God's glory," and our divine duty is to ensure that the spotlight shines on the real Hero: Jesus.

This means fighting the temptation to "think of [ourselves] more highly than [we] ought to think" (Rom. 12:3). We must see ourselves as "unworthy servants"


One day, Jesus will return to take center



(Washington, D.C., July 31, 2025) - U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Brooke L. Rollins today announced the U.S. Forest Service is investing \$106 million to support state and landowner efforts to conserve private working forestlands across the country. Funded through the Forest Legacy Program, these projects will protect forests vital to the economic and social fabric of local communities ensuring they remain productive, working forests for Americans and tourists to use and

"Just like our farms and ranches, working forests are part of the backbone of rural America - providing jobs, timber, clean water, and places for families to hunt, fish, camp, hike and make lifelong memories," said Secretary Brooke

manage our forests, empowering USDA and our state partners to protect and unleash the full potential of their forestlands to help their communities grow and thrive."

In total, the Forest Service will fund 10 projects across 177,000 acres of state- and privately owned forestlands in Arkansas, Hawaii, Iowa, Michigan, Mississippi, New York, Oregon and South Carolina. The investments advance President Trump's Executive Order on **Immediate Expansion** of American Timber Production by safeguarding forests that supply critical wood products and outdoor recreation opportunities—both of which fuel rural prosperity by creating jobs and supporting rural economies.


The Forest Legacy Program is authorized by the Cooperative

conserving these lands while balancing other local uses and goals. Projects are selected through competitive state and national processes and carried out through conservation easements or feesimple acquisitions. Lands conserved through the program either remain in private ownership with long-term protections or become new public lands managed by state or local governments.

Privately owned forests represent 60% of the nation's 704 million forested acres. These lands are essential to the social, economic, cultural, and ecological fabric of local communities and play a critical role in national timber production, supplying 88% of all domestic timber.

To date, the Forest Legacy Program has conserved more than 3.1 million acres of

Ingredients

2 tsp. kosher salt, plus more for pasta water and to

- 1 (12-oz.) package bacon
- 1 lb. cavatappi pasta
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup sour cream
- 1/2 cup buttermilk
- 1/4 cup flat-leaf parsley, chopped
- 1/4 cup fresh dill, chopped, plus more for topping
- 1 1/2 Tbsp. fresh lemon juice
- 1 garlic clove, grated
- 1 tsp. ground black pepper, plus more to taste
- 1 pt. grape tomatoes, halved
- 6 oz. sharp cheddar cheese, cut into 1/2-inch cubes
- 1 cup frozen peas, thawed
- 1 (4-oz.) container pimentos, drained
- 1 (3.8-oz.) can sliced black olives, drained
- 4 green onions, thinly sliced

Directions

Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil over

high heat.

2In a large skillet, cook the bacon over medium heat, turning as needed, until the fat has rendered and the bacon is golden and crispy, 8 to 10 minutes. (You may need to cook the bacon in 2 batches, draining the rendered fat from the skillet between batches.) Let the bacon cool to room temperature, then crumble up into bite-sized pieces.

Fiscal year to date, USDA has provided more than \$924 million in purchases, all which benefit the charitable feeding network. This is one of many actions USDA has taken to support smaller scale family farmers and producers. "This announcement continues to prioritize American commodities for families and communities in need. FDA Commissioner Makary, USDA Secretary Rollins celebrate proposed modernization of orange juice regulations

Washington, D.C., - U.S. Food and **Drug Administration** Commissioner Dr. Marty Makary, M.D., M.P.H., and U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Brooke L. Rollins this week announced plans to support American citrus growers and cut bureaucratic barriers by proposing an update to the standard of identity (SOI) for pasteurized orange juice. This America First action will end a 60-year-old rule that hurts domestic farmers and forces reliance on foreign imports. The FDA expects this change is unlikely to affect the

taste of pasteurized orange juice.

The FDA's proposed rule would reduce the minimum required Brix level – a measure of dissolved sugar content - in pasteurized orange juice from 10.5 percent to 10 percent, better reflecting the natural Brix level of American oranges. The rule change is estimated to save orange juice manufacturers more than \$50 million per year and would reduce reliance on the use of imported oranges for "not from concentrate" pasteurized orange juice products in order to meet the required Brix level.

"For years, we've been wasting beautiful American oranges simply due to an outdated regulation, while relying on a high volume of imports. **Under President** Trump's America First Administration, we're cutting red tape, helping American farmers, and using common sense to reform a broken system. And orange juice will still taste just as good," said FDA Commissioner Marty Makary, M.D., M.P.H.

"This is a big win for our citrus growers. Florida's orange growers have faced years of hardships from hurricanes, greening, and burdensome regulations that no longer reflect the realities of today's crop," said Secretary Rollins. "FDA Commissioner Makary's leadership on this and the urgent change is a commonsense reform that cuts red tape, strengthens our domestic supply chain, and ensures more American oranges end up in American breakfast glasses. I am proud to be his partner and will keep fighting every day for our American citrus industry."

Background:

The current standard has become increasingly difficult for U.S. growers to meet due to severe weather and other factors. Despite producing quality fruit, many producers have been forced to import high-Brix level orange juice from abroad to comply with this

USDA reminds families to pack food safety with back-to-school lunches

WASHINGTON,
— Back-to-school
shopping usually
means backpacks,
notebooks and
lunchboxes. But don't
forget to add food
safety to the list.

Young children, especially those under age five, are more likely to get seriously sick from foodborne illness. The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is reminding parents, caregivers, and anyone packing school lunches to follow a few simple food safety steps.

"As the school year begins, we want families to keep food safety top of mind," said USDA Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) Administrator Dr. Justin Ransom. "Young children are more vulnerable to foodborne illness, and we want to make sure they stay healthy and ready to learn."

Here are USDA's top food safety tips for the school year.

Keep cold foods cold Use at least two cold sources, such as gel packs, frozen water bottles, or frozen juice boxes. Place them on top and bottom of perishable items like meat, poultry, and eggs. This helps keep food out of the Danger Zone, which is between 40 and 140 degrees F. In this range, bacteria can grow quickly and cause illness.

Choose the right lunchbox

Use an insulated lunchbox. Paper bags are not a safe choice because they tear and leak as cold items thaw, which allows cold air to escape.

Keep hot foods hot
For hot foods like
soup or chili, use an
insulated container.
Fill it with boiling
water and let it sit for
a few minutes before
adding food. Dump out
the water, add the hot
food, and keep the lid
closed until lunchtime.
Hot foods should stay
at 140 degrees F or
higher.

Follow the four steps to food safety

Clean: Wash hands with soapy water for at least 20 seconds before, during, and after handling food. Clean and sanitize lunchboxes regularly.

Separate: Keep raw meat and poultry separate from fruits, vegetables, and other ready-to-eat foods. Discard any containers or bags that held raw items.

Cook: Use a food thermometer to make sure foods are cooked to a safe internal temperature.

Chill: Use two cold sources to keep perishable foods below 40 degrees F. Discard leftovers if they enter the Danger Zone (between 40 and 140 degrees F) for more than two hours.

The FDA will accept public comments through November 4, 2025.
